Sources: Cross-check information

Please avoid using Wikipedia as a source. Instead, prefer the ULiège Library or Google Scholar for your research.

Always verify information by consulting multiple sources to ensure accuracy.



Drafting the slides: Avoid complex slides

- Avoid using text and bullet points.
- Try to limit the number of ideas per slide to one, if possible.
- Avoid colored backgrounds; opt for white, simple, and effective designs instead.
- Ensure that figures are not too small; they should be legible and support your message.
